OUR GUEST ORGANIST TODAY IS DENNIS JAMES—otherwise known as the strange man taking notes at several prior services. Dennis is a professional musician and glass artist. He earned his Bachelors and Masters degrees at Indiana University and has attended glass frameworking workshops since 2011 at The Studio in Corning, NY; and at the Penland School and Chrysler Museum among smaller schools on both coasts. He has held a residency at the Anderson Center and has been the recipient of numerous grants and awards.



Dennis has been teaching in higher education since 2011 having founded Glass Music Studies at the Graduate Level at Rutgers University, the first such academic course of study in the field. He lives in Corning, New York where his artistic practices involve how glass as a material can resonate with sonic complexities and investigating how the elapse of time and space can transfigure social attitudes towards both the design and use of themed sculptural objects.
